

CEP 2022: Surge in Activism, Support to Enemy Resistance, and Shift in Corruption Perceptions



Methodology: quantitative survey of Ukrainian population

Sample size 2,024 respondents

Sample design The interviews were conducted with the residents of Ukraine aged 18 years old and older. Sample design corresponds to the distribution of adult population of Ukraine by age, sex, oblast and settlement type according to the data of the State Statistics Service of Ukraine as of January 1, 2019 (excluding AR Crimea and NGCA of Donetska and Luhanska oblasts).

Method CATI: Computer-assisted telephone interviews

Fieldwork dates July-August 2022

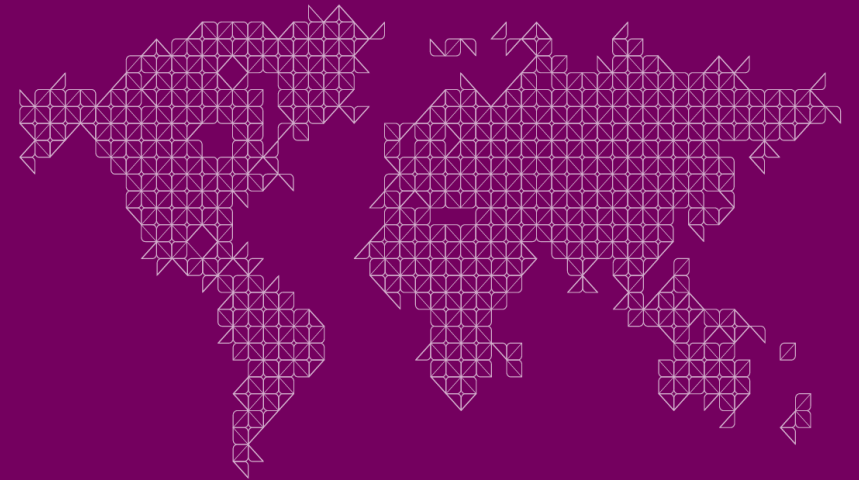
Margin of error Margin of sample error (not including design effect) does not exceed 2.2% for national sample. It can be different for every response to every question in all surveys.



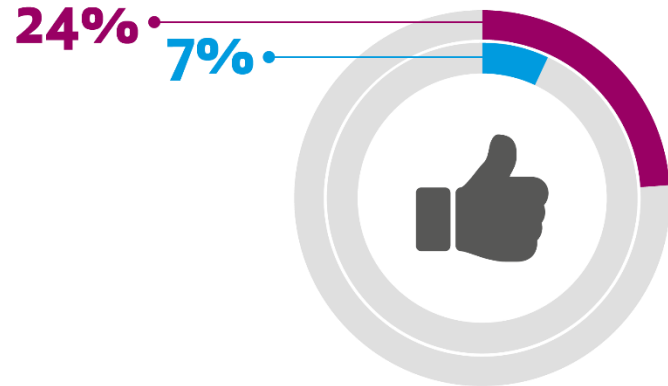

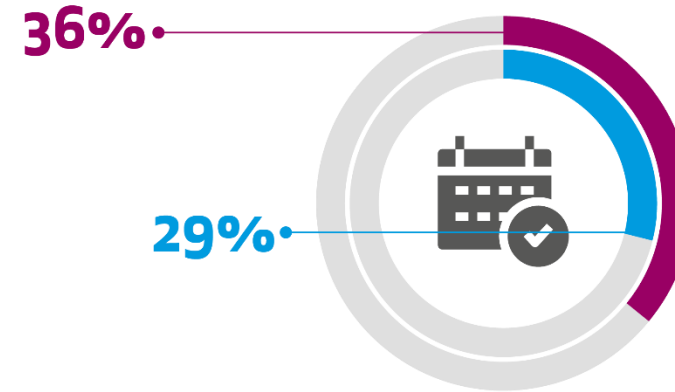

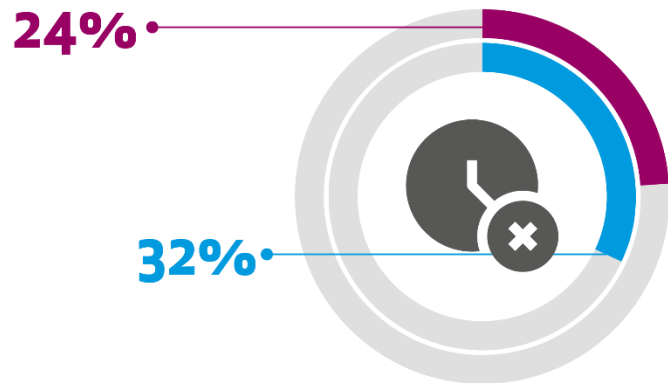
Q. Are you engaged in life of your community (house, street, district)?



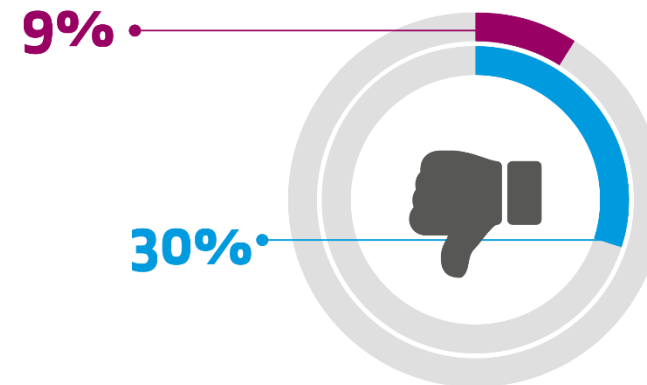

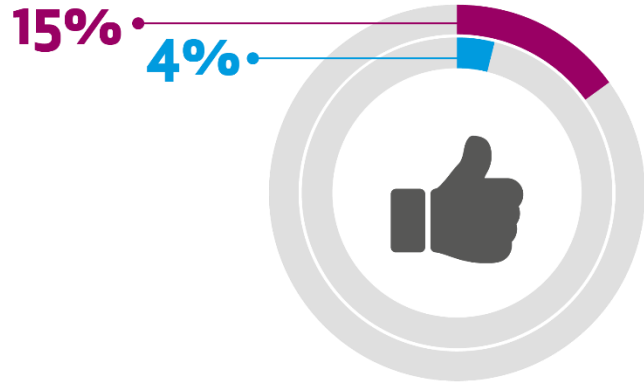

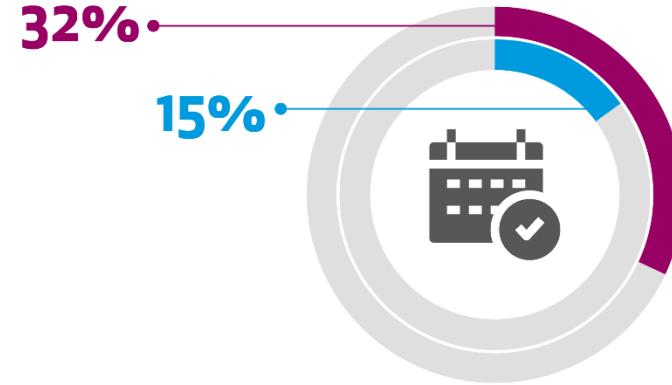

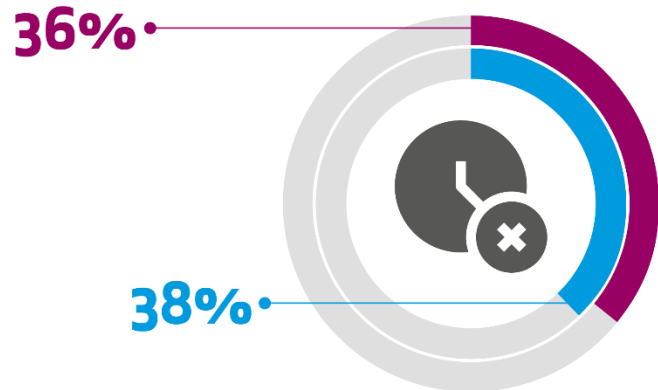
Q. Did you participate in CSO activities during the last year?



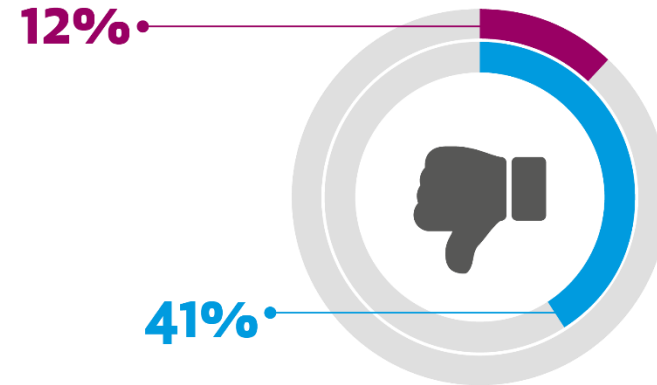
Yes, I participated actively

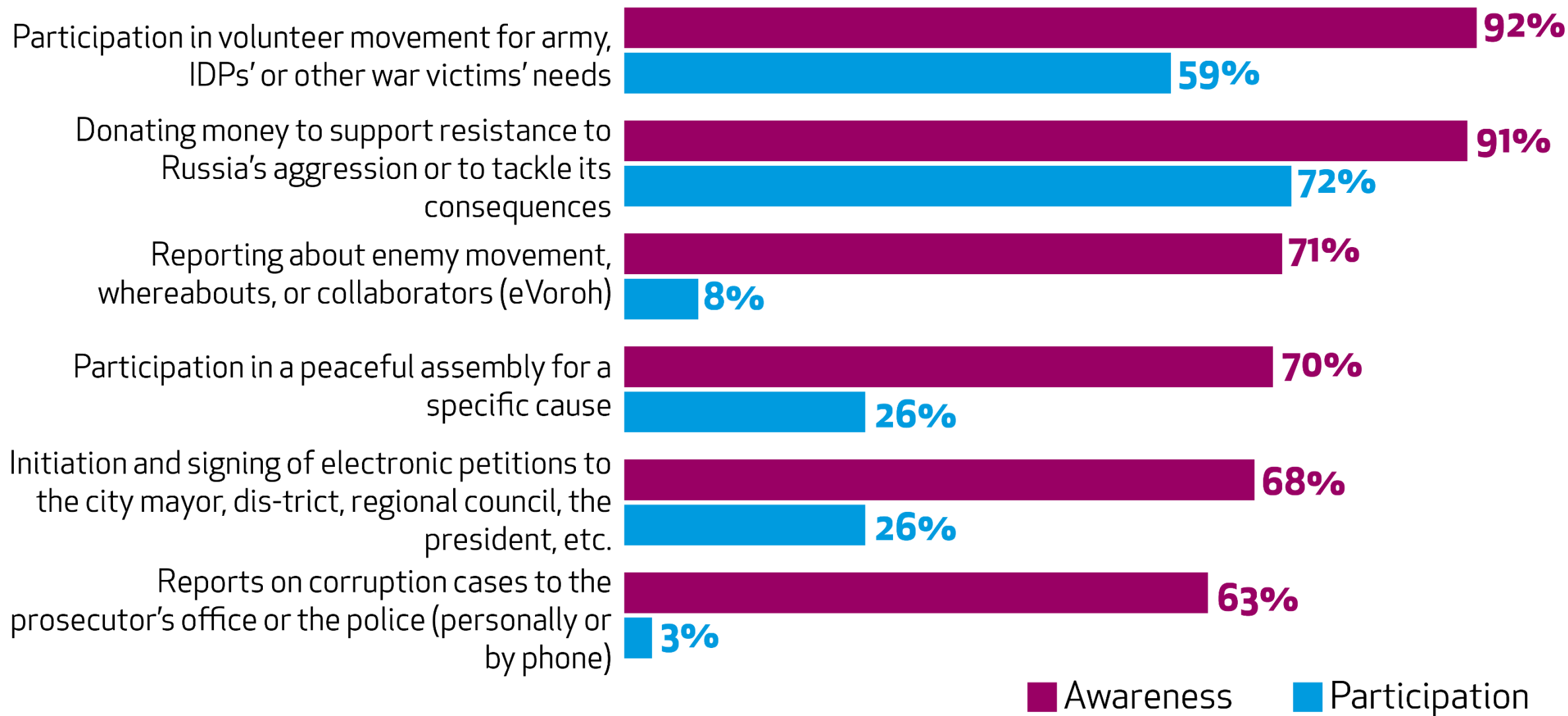

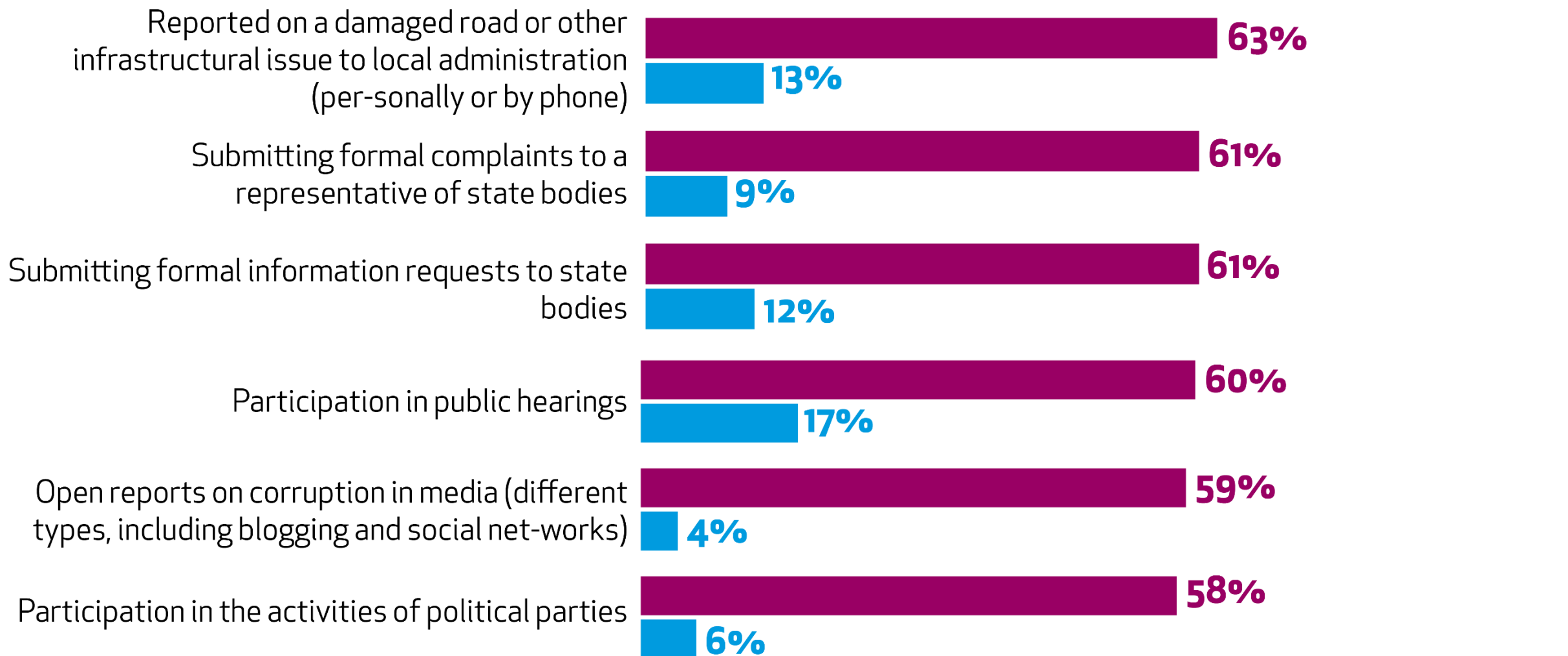

Q. Are you aware about the following / Did you participate in the last 12 months in: (1/3)

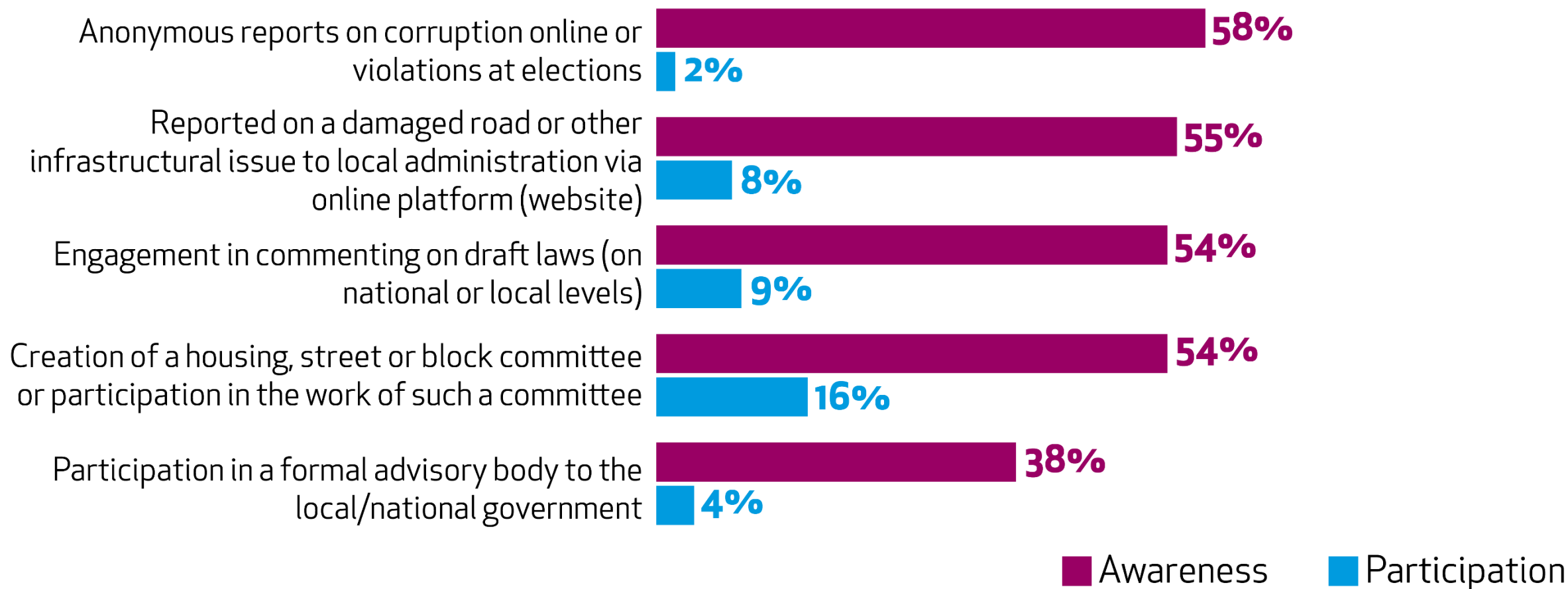


Q. Are you aware about the following / Did you participate in the last 12 months in: (2/3)

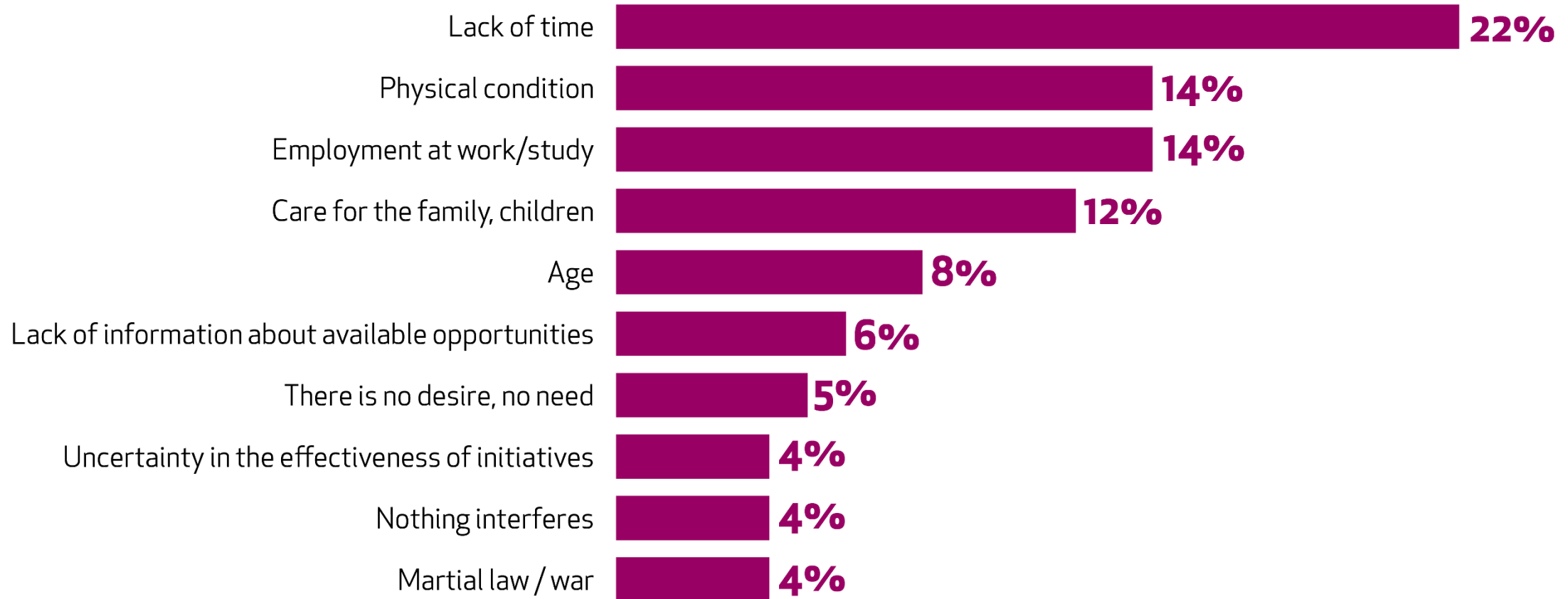

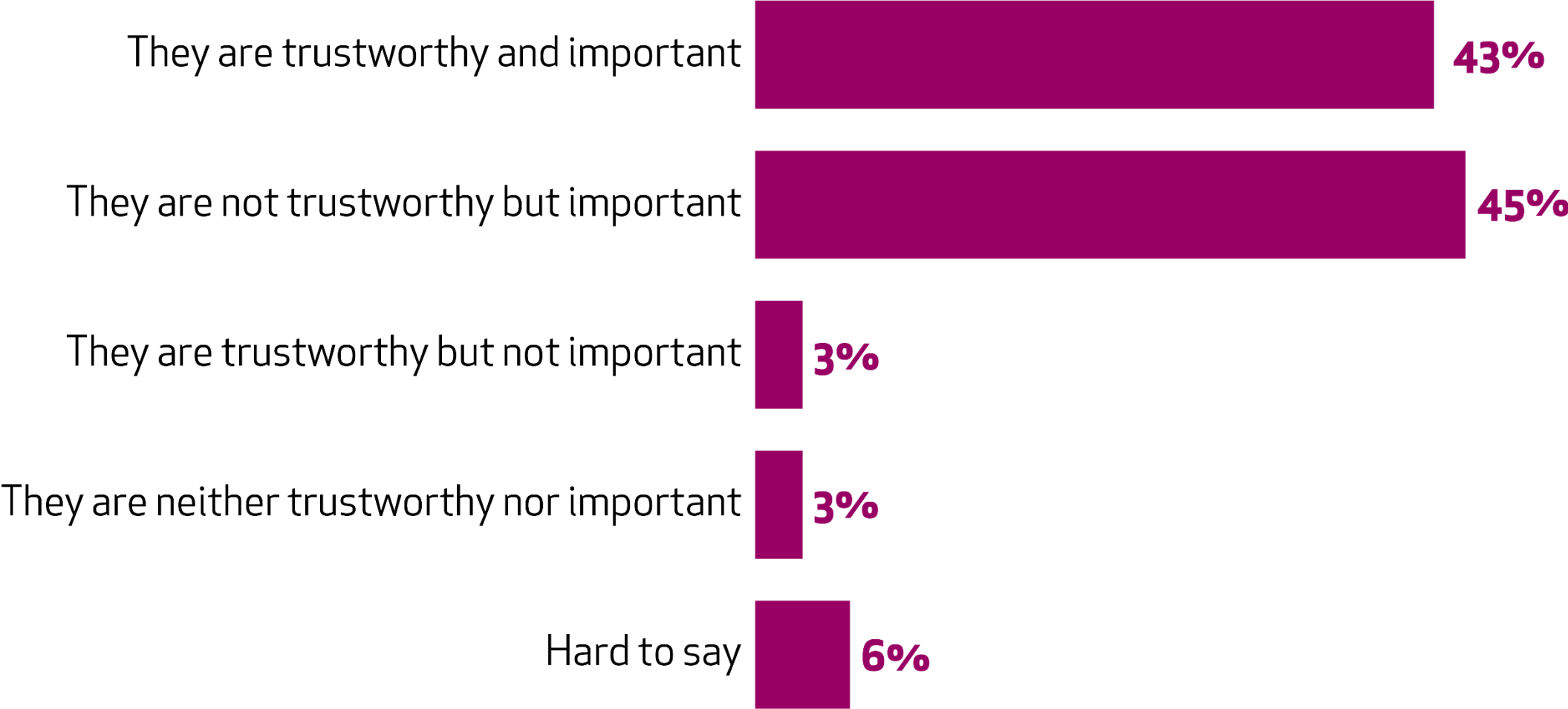

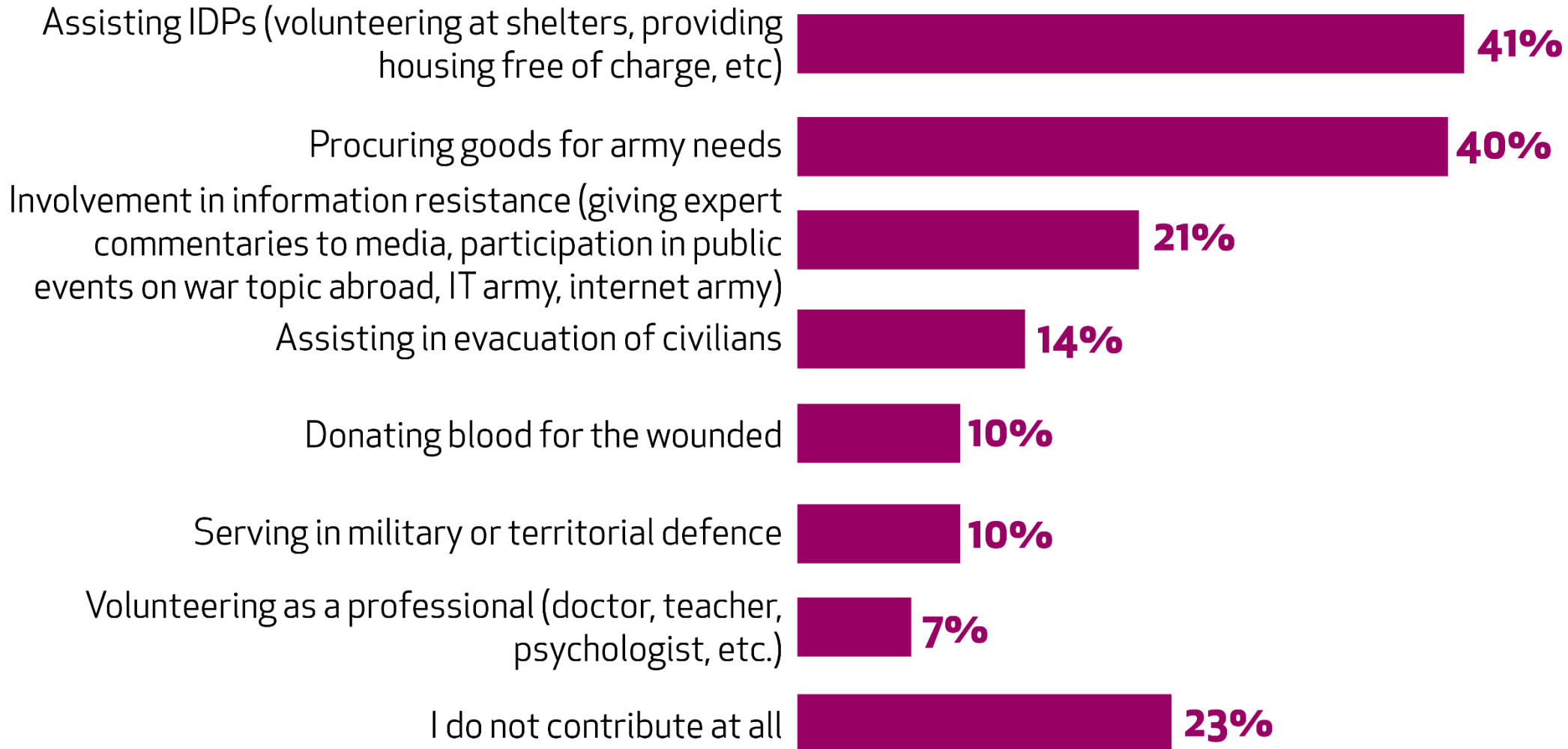
Q. What prevents you from more active engagement in civil initiatives? (open-ended)



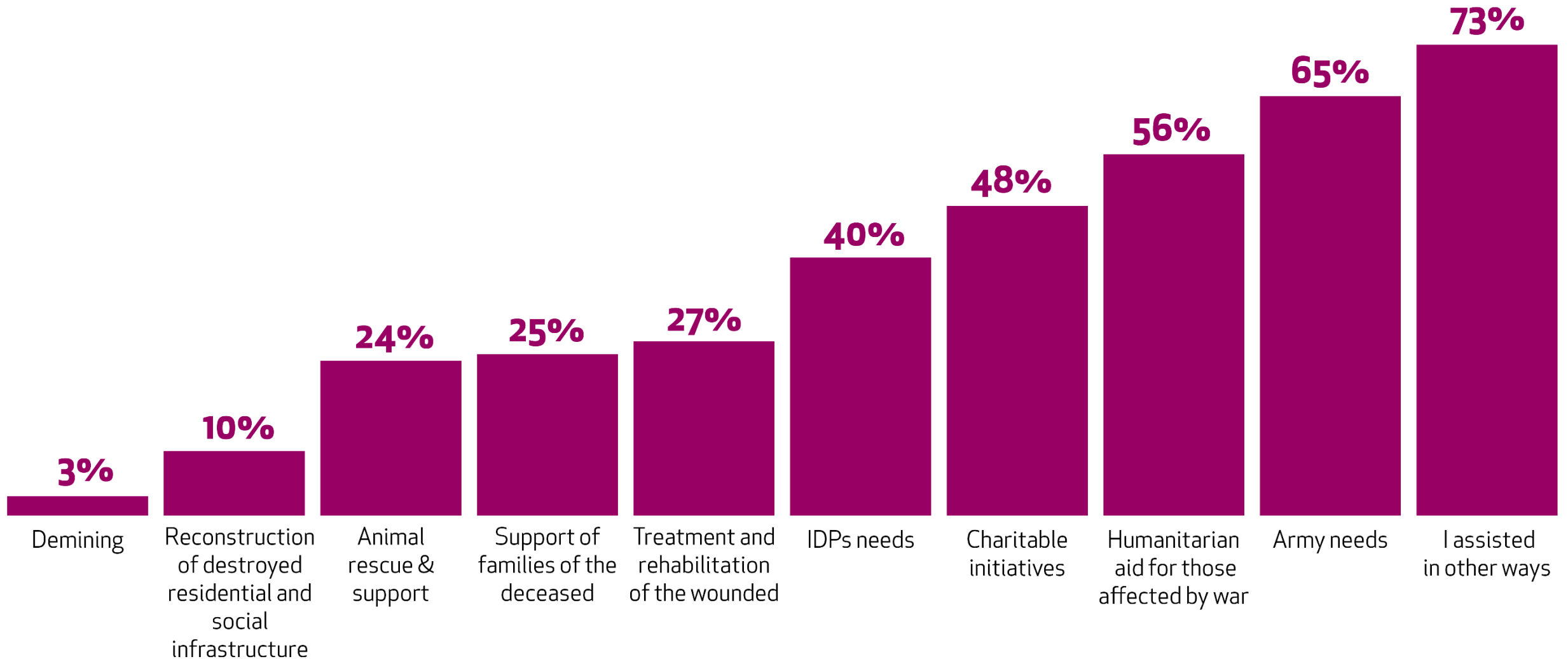

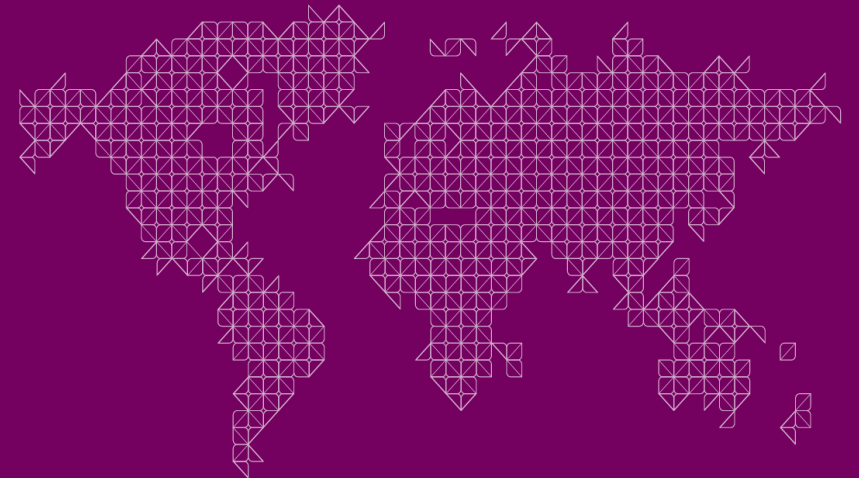

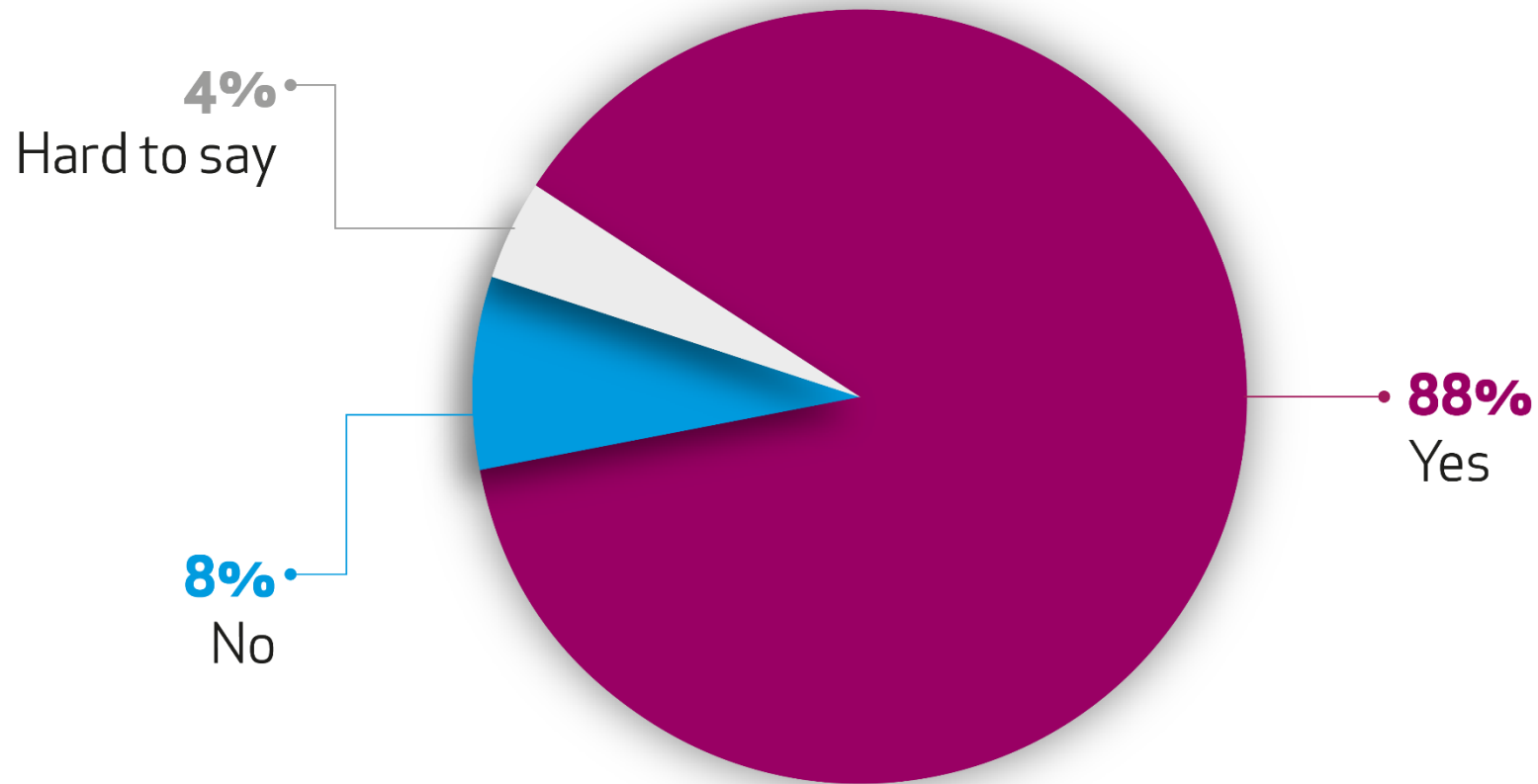

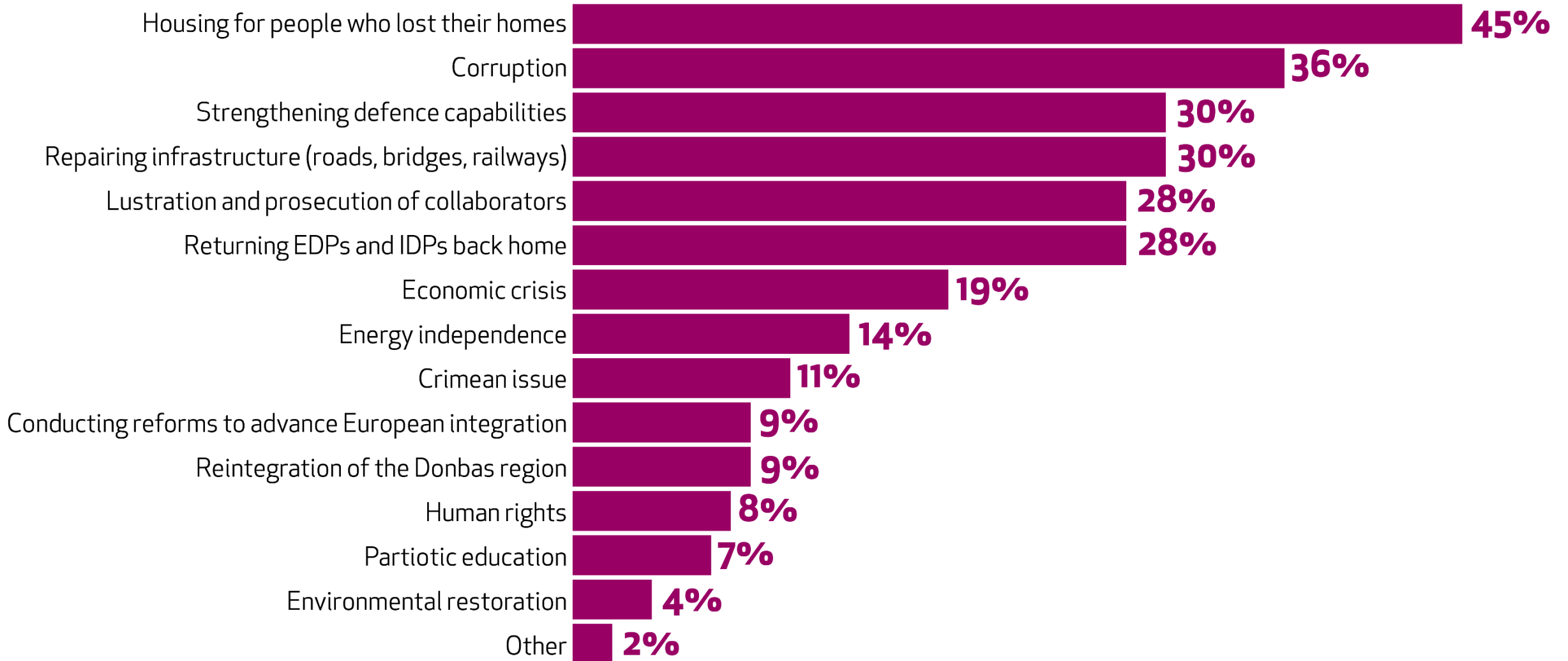

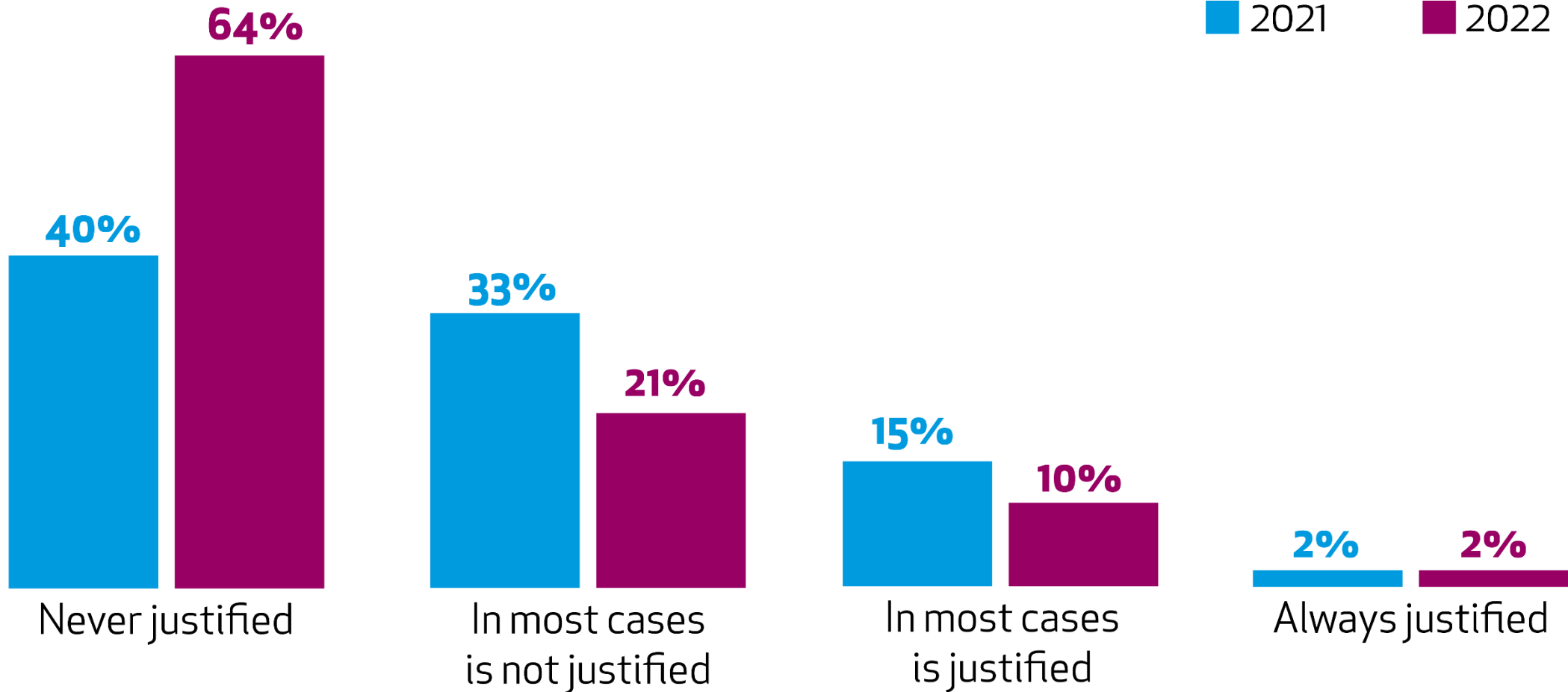
Q. Should Ukraine continue the ongoing reforms (e.g. judicial, healthcare, decentralization, education, etc.) regardless of the war?



Q. Choose the three most important issues Ukraine should resolve after the war

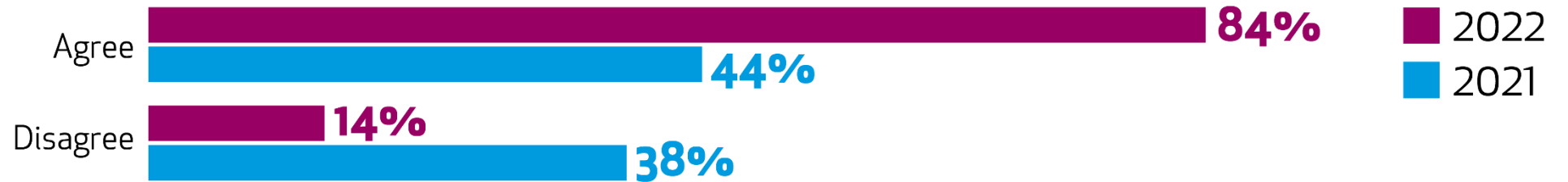


Q. Do you believe that giving bribes, unofficial services, or gifts can be justified if it is necessary for solving a problem which is important for you?

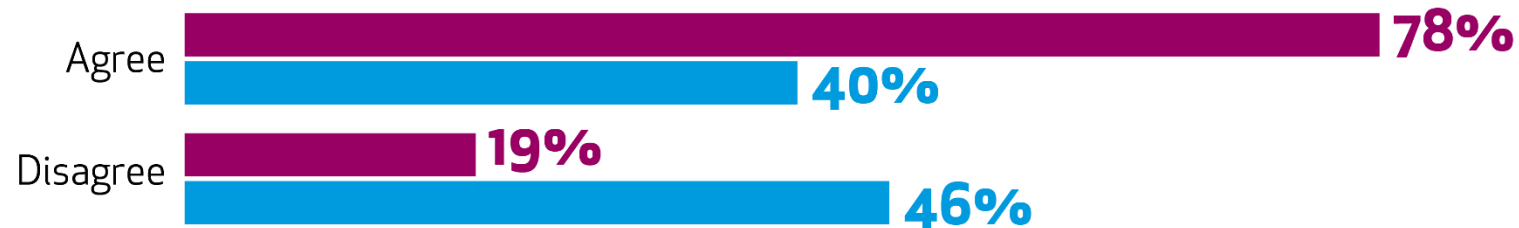

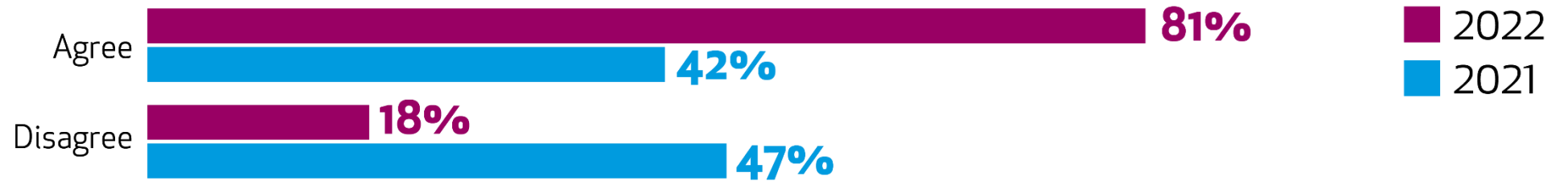

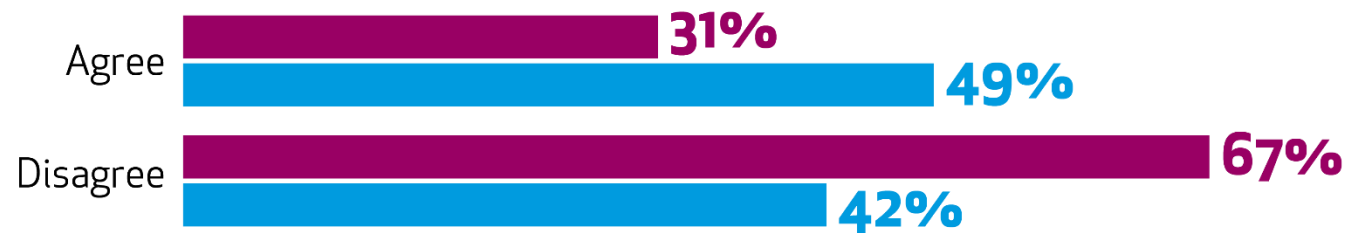


Q. How much you agree or disagree with each of these statements? (2/2)

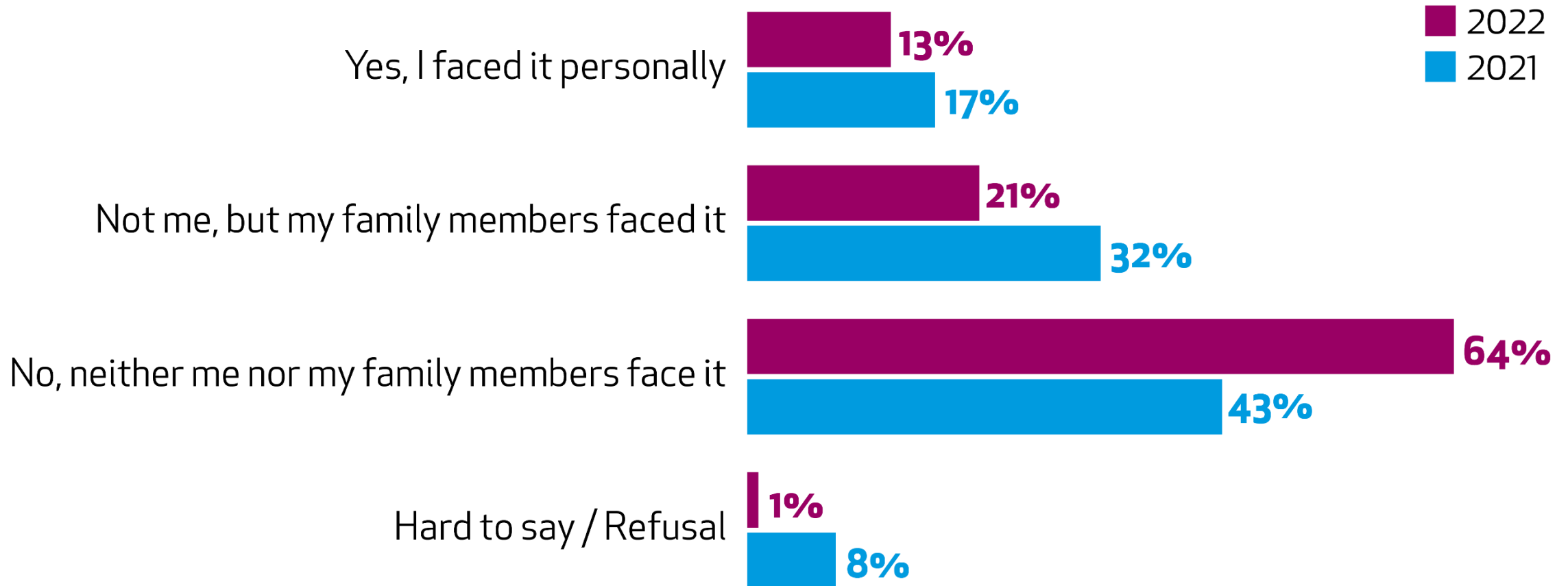

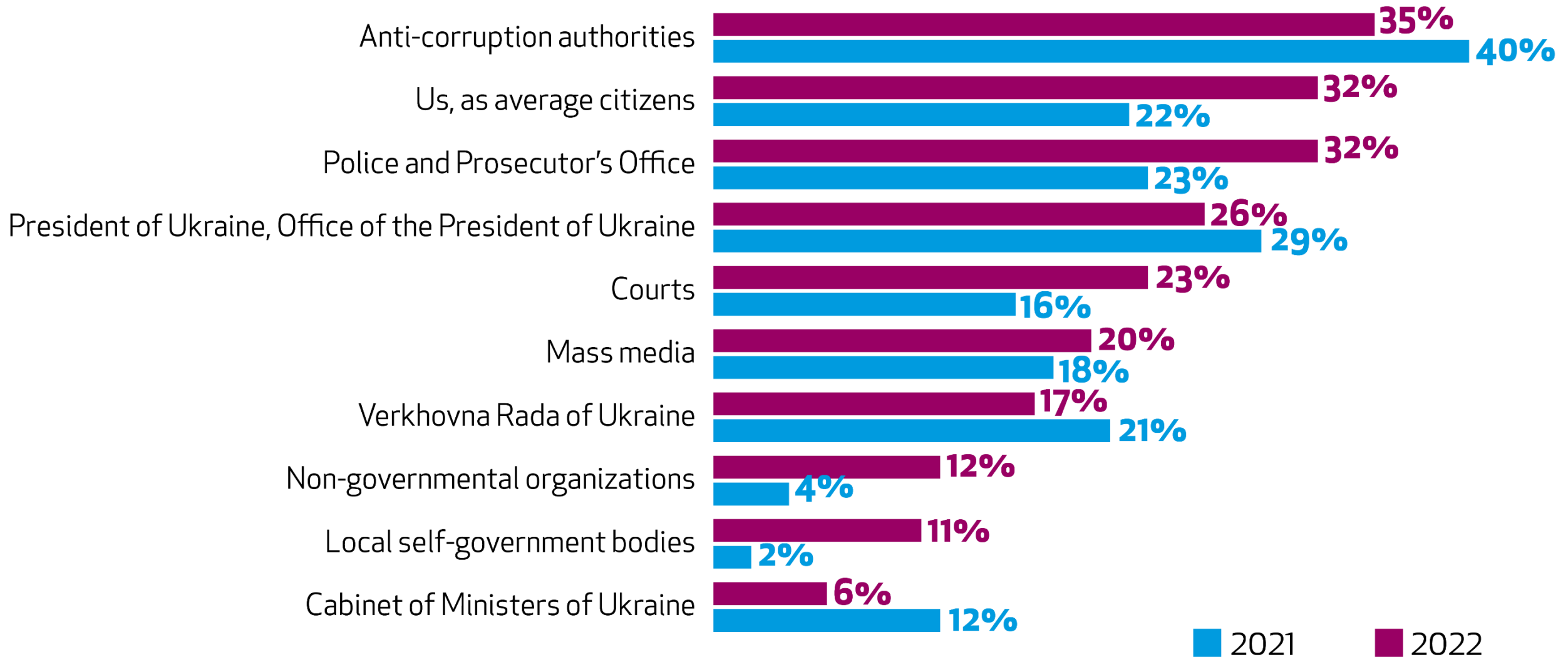

Q. Have you or your family members directly faced corruption (bribe, extortion, nepotism, etc.) during the last 12 months?

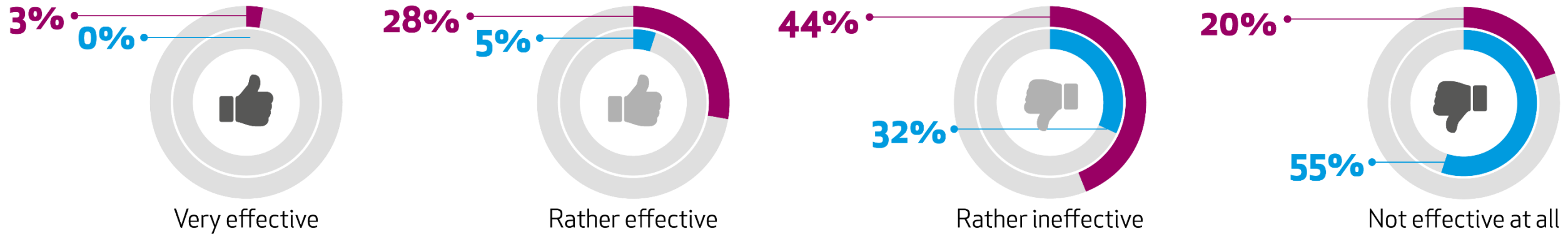


Q. In your opinion, who has the biggest role to play in countering corruption in Ukraine?

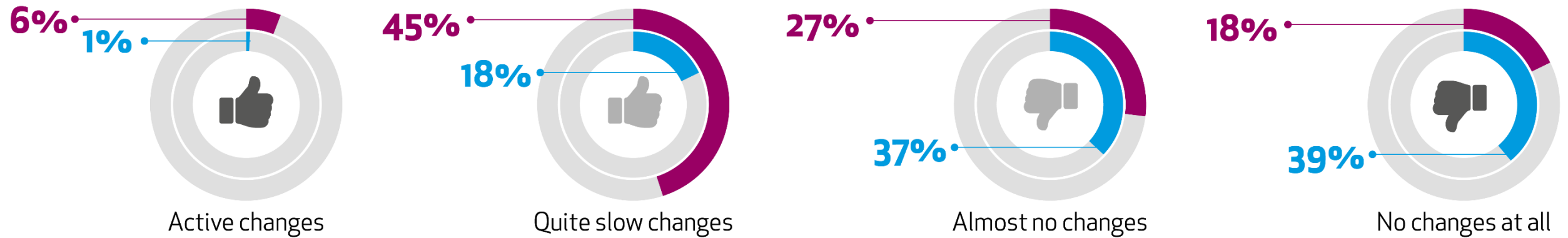

Q. In your opinion, to what extent is the government of Ukraine effective in fighting corruption?

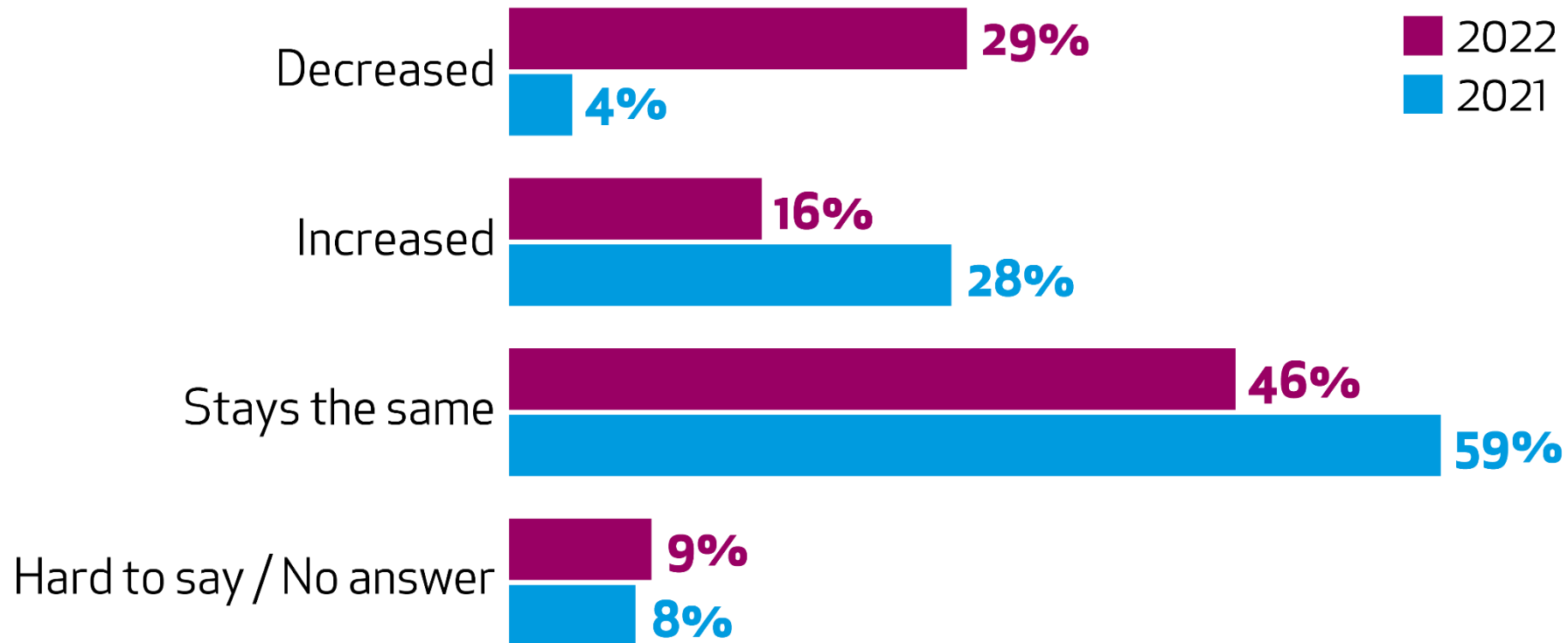


Q. In your opinion, what is the progress of anti-corruption reform?

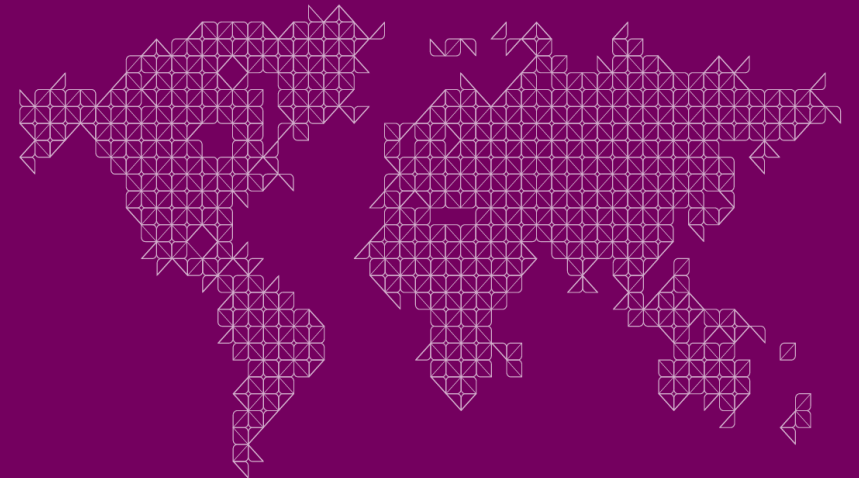
Q. In your opinion, the corruption rate increased, decreased or stays the same during the last 12 months?



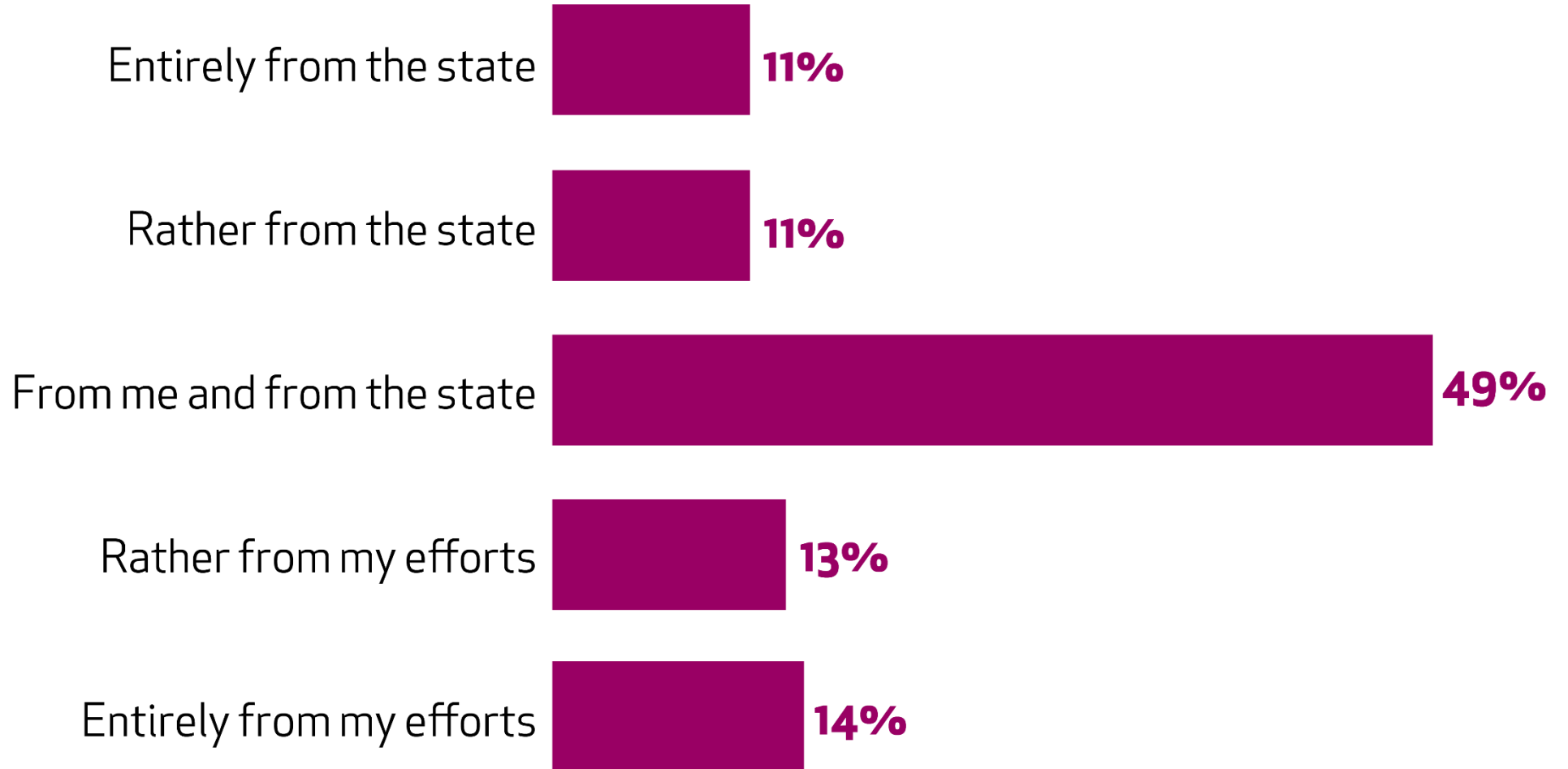
