

Public opinion survey to assess the changes in citizen's awareness of civil society and their activities

Methodology: quantitative survey of Ukrainian population

Sample size

2,011 residents of Ukraine.

Sample design

The interviews were conducted with the residents of Ukraine aged 18 years old and older. Sample design corresponds to the distribution of adult population of Ukraine by age, sex, oblast and settlement type according to the data of the State Statistics Service of Ukraine as of January 1, 2018 (excluding AR Crimea and NGCA of Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts).

Method

CAPI: face-to-face interviews on tablets at respondent's home





Margin of error

Margin of sample error (not including design effect) does not exceed 2.2% for national sample. It can be different for every response to every question in all surveys. On these slides, the margin of error is shown for each question/option


This is shown on example here.

between K and A








Q: Are you engaged in life of your community (house, street, district)?






Q: Did you participate in CSO activities during the last year?











Q: Do you plan to vote in the next local elections?




Q: What 3 factors are most likely to determine your choice of a candidate in local elections?





Q: Between two equally honest and professional candidates, would you prefer a male or female candidate?








Q: Choose the three most important issues for Ukraine today






Q: Choose the three most important issues for you and your family today






Q: Have you already felt any particular consequences of reform?










Q: Would you like to move from your city/region in the near future?






Q: Have you traveled abroad to Western Europe since 2017?






Q: Do you know any person that has moved from your city/region to Western Europe and is satisfied with this decision?












Q: In your opinion, who has the biggest role to play in countering corruption in Ukraine? No more than 3 answers






Q: In your opinion, what is the progress of anti-corruption reforms?




Q: In your opinion, to what extent is the government of Ukraine effective in fighting corruption?





Q: Do you believe that giving bribes, unofficial services, or gifts can be justified if it is necessary for solving a problem which is important for you?






Q: In your opinion, the corruption rate increased, decreased or stays the same during the last 12 months?






Q: Have you or your family members directly faced corruption (bribe, extortion, nepotism, etc.) during the last 12 months?














Q: Do you belong to any group of people who experience discrimination in Ukraine?




Q: Are you ready to support other groups of people from the list above (groups to which you do not belong) in defending their rights?




















Q: With which of the following statements do you tend to agree more?







