

MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY





The goal of the study is a comprehensive assessment of the situation with corruption in Ukraine in 2023

Objectives of the study:

- assessment of the state anti-corruption efforts in Ukraine
- assessment of the understanding and perception of corruption
- taking stock of the corruption experience of the population and businesses
- assessment of the level of prevalence of corrupt practices in the following sectors:










The general index of perception of corruption has increased to the level of 2020






Central authorities along with specialized institutions are considered responsible for combating corruption


Businesses: assessments also decreased. Among all anti-corruption agencies, the efforts by the NABU and SAPO received the highest ratings

(average score on a 5-point scale, where 1 means that anti-corruption efforts are completely ineffective, and 5 means that they are highly effective)









General methods of assessing the corruption experience





Approach 1

Direct method (self-assessment) by which respondents determine whether they had any experience with corruption (general question «Have you faced corruption in the past 12 months...?»)

The indicator that is most stable for comparison purposes across different study waves is used as one of the indicators of effectiveness of the state anticorruption policy

Approach 2

Self-assessment by respondents of their experience with corruption during interaction/contacts with a specific sector (answers to a direct question)

It can be used for comparison between different study waves (within each sector)

Approach 3

Determination of the degree of prevalence of corrupt practices in sectors based on the confirmation by respondents that they faced certain contact situations showing attributes of corruption

This integral indicator (a share of respondents who found themselves in corruption situations*) depends on the list of corrupt practices offered for assessment

^{*} The integral indicator of being in corrupt situations is calculated as the share of respondents who chose any answer other than "No such situation" (we consider the options "Other" or "Refused to answer" to be socially acceptable substitutes for answers about involvement in a corrupt situation).















INTEGRAL INDICATORS OF THE STATE ANTI-CORRUPTION **POLICY**

5 indicators of the state anti-corruption policy were established





- Share of the population/businesses with a **negative attitude** towards manifestations of corruption
- Share of the population/businesses that had their own corruption experience
- Share of the population/businesses capable of exposing corruption
- 4 Share of the population/businesses approving the activity of corruption whistleblowers
- 5 Share of the population **aware of the guarantees** of legal protection for whistleblowers



Indicator 2. Share of the population/businesses that had their own corruption experience






Direct question about the respondents' self-assessment of their involvement in corruption:

Indicator 3.1. Share of the population/businesses capable of exposing corruption







Indicator 3.2. Share of those who reported the corruption situation to the authorities





Indicator 4. Share of the population/businesses approving the activity of corruption whistleblowers





CONCLUSIONS





Indicators of perception of corruption and corruption experience





- Corruption continues to rank **2nd** among the biggest **challenges** for Ukraine (after the russian military aggression): **71.6**% of *population* and **73**% of *businesses* representatives consider corruption to be a *very serious* problem
- More than 80% of respondents (87.9% of the *population* and 81.3% of *businesses*) believe that corruption is somewhat or extremely **prevalent** in Ukraine. These indicators have *increased* significantly in both audiences (respectively by 6.8 p.p. and 12.1 p.p. more than in 2022).
- There is a deterioration in the assessment of the **dynamics of the level of corruption** in 2023.

 An increase in the level of corruption is noted by 61.2% of the population (more than twice as much as in 2022 (29.2%)) and 46.3% of business representatives, which is almost three times more than the figure in 2022 (16%)

Indicators of perception of corruption and corruption experience





- According to respondents, combating corruption is the **responsibility** of the central authorities (President of Ukraine and his Office, the Parliament) and the NABU this opinion has not changed for the last three years.
- As for **anti-corruption activities effectiveness** estimates, they have markedly and statistically significantly **decreased** for all the authorities both among the *population* and *entrepreneurs*, which is a correction of perception after 2022 increase (however, these estimates are higher than those of 2021).
 - According to the assessment of **corruption experience** of the *population*, the highest risk of encountering corruption is present for those who apply to **service centers of the MIA**, receive services involving **construction and land relations**, **healthcare**, and connection to **power**, **gas**, **water supply**, **and sewer systems**.
 - In the opinion of *businesses*, the ranking of the most corrupt sectors for the last three years is topped by **customs control** as well as **law enforcement**, and like among population, **construction and land relations**, as well as **electricity**, **gas**, **and water supply**
 - In the past 12 months, **corrupt relations were initiated** by **12.1%** of the Ukrainian *population* and **3.9%** of representatives of *businesses*. Meanwhile, **20.8%** of the *population* and **11.9%** of *businesses* were involved in corrupt relations because of **demands** made by representatives of the authorities or organizations and institutions in the relevant sectors

Indicators of effectiveness of state anti-corruption policy





There is a discernible gradual *increase* in the share of *population* with a **negative attitude towards manifestations of corruption**: in 2017 this share reached 43,3%, in 2022 it significantly exceeded one half of the population (57,4%), and in 2023 it has now stabilized at **56,0%**.

The share of the anti-corruption minded *businesses* has stabilized after an increase in 2022 (60,3%) and is now at **57,8%**. Thus, in 2023, the shares of business representatives and members of the public who refuse the corrupt model of behavior have equaled.

- The share of the *population* that had **their own experience of corruption** have stabilized after decreasing in 2022 and is now at **19,5%** (increase from 17,7% in 2022 is not statistically significant). But in the *business* audience, there is a negative *trend* towards an increase in the share of enterprises that have experienced corruption: in 2023, this indicator is **22.2%** (a statistically significant *increase* from 15.4% in 2022).
- The share of citizens **ready to report** facts of manifestations of corruption has stabilized at the level of 2022 after increasing and is now **10.2%** among the *population*, and **26.9%** among *businesses*.

Indicators of effectiveness of state anti-corruption policy





- The share of respondents who **reported incidents of corruption** against them to the relevant authorities remains **low** but continues the *trend of growth* among the *business audience* (from 10.5% in 2021 to **14.0%** in 2023).
 - Among the *population*, the dynamics are practically absent in the period of 2021–2023, and the share of such respondents ranges from 5.2% to 6.5% (for 2023).

The shares of respondent who **approve of the activity of whistleblowers** decreased in 2021 but **increased** in 2022 and continues to **grow** in 2023: the absolute majority of the **population** (67.3%) and **businesses** (89.6%) approve of their activity.

Only **16,1%** of the population could be considered **aware of the guarantees of legal protection for whistleblowers** in 2023; this indicator this indicator remains at approximately the same level in 2021-2023.
